The agenda for the meeting (which details what is to be discussed) is placed on the noticeboard in the foyer of the Social Welfare Centre on the Friday before the meeting.

If you wish to speak at the meeting, all you need to do is contact the Clerk before the meeting. You would be able to speak at the Public Participation section of the meeting. A maximum of 20 minutes is allowed for the public. To find out more, please contact the Clerk.

Did you know that there is a totally free delivery service of books, talking books or information to County Durham residents who have problems getting to the library, because of disability or mobility problems?

To be accepted onto the service, there is an informal assessment procedure. A member of Durham County Library staff will visit you at home, take a few details and discuss your reading needs. Based on this, a bag of books will be chosen for you. Every three weeks, a new bag will be brought to you.

They also need volunteers to help deliver the service, particularly in the Peterlee area.

Annual Report Summary

Our aim is to give residents information about the Parish Council and the services which we deliver in the village, to outline how we are dealing with current challenges and highlight our plans to meet community needs and deliver quality services in the next year and beyond.

REVIEW OF 2006/07 Welfare Park

Following the completion of the restoration of the Welfare Park, 2006/07 has been a year of much less change. The park was awarded a Green Flag and Green Heritage Site status in August, we are the only Parish Council run park in the country to achieve the Green Flag! The range of events and activities organised within the Welfare Park have increased significantly since the restoration.



Social Welfare Centre

The Social Welfare Centre continues to be used by many residents and community groups. Activities ranging from Mother and Toddler sessions to dancing classes and advice sessions all take place on weekdays, whilst the building is used for functions and parties at weekends.

Thorpe Road Cemetery

During 2006/07 79 burials took place. In addition to the burials which took place, 9 memorial plaques were sold for display on the Memorial Wall.

In February 2006 the Parish Council decided to ban the use of solar powered lights within the cemetery this decision has upset many relatives, both residents and non-residents, as a result, the Council did further public consultation during 2006/07 which resulted in the decision being changed. We now allow two lights to be placed on graves subject to guidelines.



Memorial Park

Having undertaken a number of capital projects in recent years, 2006/07 has been one of general ongoing maintenance at Memorial Park. Those of you who visit the park regularly will be impressed with the excellent standards achieved at Memorial Park.

During the year a management and maintenance plan has been prepared for the park, which revealed some interesting facts.



Church Green

During 2006/07 the Council replaced some of the seating on the green and installed new litter bins.

Sunderland Road Playing Fields & Play Area

In October 2006, as part of the preparations for Northumbria in Bloom, children from Cotsford Infant School planted 5000 crocus bulbs with Parish Council staff, resulting in a beautiful display in the spring!

Station Road Allotments

The committee continue to work with the Parish Council organising the annual Flower and Vegetable Show.

Cotsford Park Play Area

During October 2006 a new play area was installed. The design was chosen by local residents from five choices. Although there is still some grass regrowth needed, the area is looking good and providing excellent play facilities for children in the area.



Maritime Crescent Play Area, Grants Houses

This area was also redeveloped in October 2006, five designs were put on display for public consultation. The one chosen was by far the most popular. Some grass regrowth is needed to finish off the area, but this should take place as spring approaches!

Northumbria in Bloom

Following on from the success in Northumbria in Bloom 2005 Competition,

the village were awarded a Bronze award in 2006.



Quality Council Status

Quality Council Status is a standard developed by the government by which Parish & Town Councils can prove that they meet certain quality criteria. Horden Parish Council applied for this standard in 2007, we are awaiting accreditation.

Finance

During 2006/07 the Council set a budget of £521,794. It is estimated that we spent £595,784 during the year, which includes some expenditure from earmarked reserves on capital projects such as the new play areas. (Please note that these figures are subject to adjustment as year end final figures are still being calculated and will be available at audit in the summer of 2007).

The Audit Commission appointed external auditors, BDO Stoy Hayward, have set the audit date for the 2006/07 accounts as 13th July 2007. By law, any interested person has the right to inspect the Council's accounts. Any registered elector also has the right to ask questions about the accounts or challenge an item of account within them. The accounts will be available for public inspection for 20 working days between 11th June and 6th July 2007 for this purpose. If you wish to exercise your right to inspect the accounts, please contact the Clerk to the Council, Samantha Shippen between the hours of 10a.m. and 4pm on any of those dates stated.

Strategic Plan

In October 2006, the Council continued a formal process of planning for the next 5 years and beyond. Much has been achieved in the past five years and the Council wish to continue to improve services whilst concentrating on keeping increases to a minimum.

We hope to implement the items in the strategic plan identified for 2007/08, we will continue to run events for the community in the Welfare Park and continue to work hard to make Horden a better place in which to live!
